This includes urban and rural places; parks and gardens; cemeteries; industrial sites; and Aboriginal places. She has experience in Aboriginal cultural heritage and the recognition of Aboriginal cultural values in heritage reviews, interpretation plans and thematic histories. Helen has also prepared significance assessments for local history collections, and text panels for interpretative signage and exhibitions. Prior to joining GML Heritage (formerly Context), she worked as a freelance historian for various heritage consultancies.

Helen is also an award-winning writer and experienced editor. She was an assistant editor for the major reference work in Australian history: *The Oxford Companion to Australian History*, eds G. Davison, S. Macintyre and J. Hirst (Oxford University Press, 1998).
