Dr Constance Wyndham is an accomplished heritage and museums specialist. She holds a PhD in Critical Heritage Studies and a Masters in Museum Studies from the Institute of Archaeology at University College London, and a Bachelor's degree in art and architectural history from the University of East Anglia, Norwich.

Constance has extensive experience in international museums and heritage work, particularly in international development contexts. This has included work in designing public programs and community engagement for the British Museum and Leighton House Museum in London. In Afghanistan, she managed cultural projects for the Kabul based NGO Turquoise Mountain, an organisation that has rebuilt parts of Kabul's Old City and established an institute for training Afghan craftsmen and craftswomen. Also in Kabul, she worked as a registrar on a project to digitise the entire collection of the National Museum of Afghanistan. As a consultant she has worked as part of a team to evaluate UNESCO's strategy to protect cultural and natural heritage in emergency scenarios.

Constance has a strong research background. She has worked as a sessional lecturer at the Institute of Archaeology at University College London, the Courtauld Institute of Art and the University of Sydney. She has experience in planning and managing projects, data analysis and report writing.
